



Bretforton Village School SEND Information Report

Special arrangements in relation to national lockdown due to COVID-19.

From January, the government announced another national lockdown.

Following the guidelines provided by the government, which can be found below:

Bretforton Village School will be providing the following:

- Children will be taught in two bubbles.
- Reception and Year 1 children will be taught in one bubble with Mrs Hancock, Mrs Derby, Mrs Lee, Miss Ellis and Mrs Glass on a rota system.
- Years 2-5 will be taught by Mrs Derby, Mrs Howard, Miss Barnett, Miss Haines and Mrs Townsend on a rota system.

Children will have access to their relevant curriculum through planned lessons, set by class teachers, which will:

- Offer a broad and balanced curriculum
- Cover any knowledge and skills missed during the Covid-19 pandemic
- Support any well-being needs children may have

If a child with Special Educational Needs is at school or home:

Children will have access to all provisions as listed in the SEND information report.

These include:

- Provision required for a child to meet the outcomes on their Education Health Care Plans.
- Visual supports such as visual timetables, working memory boards, now and next cards or task management plans if required
- Coloured overlays and sensory resources if required.
- Access to external professionals, such as the schools Educational Psychologist, Speech and Language Therapy will continue.

For children in school:

- In class provisions, such as visual timetables, physical resources e.g numicon, Sensory circuit activities and SALT activities.
- Intervention support in line with targets stated in Individual Provision Plans

For children at home:

- Access to Inclusion at Bretforton Village School resources to support all SEN areas of need

- Online provisions as set out in home learning
- Personalised learning packs in relation to targets for Individual's Individual Provision Plan (IPP) targets

For all SEND children:

- Interventions will continue where possible, if this is not possible children will receive personalised packs whereby their targets can be achieved remotely.
- Children with SEND will have access to break out spaces, should they need time out of their classroom for any reason relating to their needs.
- Individual Provision Plans will continue to be in place for children on the SEND register and reviews will be conducted via Zoom or telephone call.
- EHCP annual reviews or meetings will be held via Zoom call with relevant professionals and parents.
- Outside agencies will begin providing interventions within school or online via Zoom/Telephone calls, where necessary, following all guidance on social distancing and hygiene.

The offer shown below applies to any children that are being taught remotely.

As stated in the government guidance:

'Where a class, group or small number of pupils need to self-isolate, or there is lockdown requiring pupils to remain at home, we expect schools to have the capacity to offer immediate remote education'.

Should there be a case for children to work from home, Bretforton Village School will ensure:

- Work will be set by class teachers. It will take in to account the needs of the pupils in their classes and will follow a well-sequenced curriculum so that knowledge and skills are built incrementally, with a good level of clarity about what is intended to be taught and practised in each subject
- Teachers will check in via zoom calls/ telephone calls/ emails regularly to gauge how well pupils are progressing through the curriculum
- Class teachers will provide resources for individual SEND children relating to the outcomes/targets on their EHCP or Individual Provision Plans.
- Class teachers will use remote education resources such as Oak National Academy specialist content for pupils with SEND. This will complement the other remote education resources set by the class teacher.
- We will provide home learning packs for pupils who do not have suitable online access or are unable to print resources.

Resources that support our pupils' SEND needs have been uploaded on to the school website in the Inclusion section. If you require anything further please do ask the SENCo or class teacher.

External agencies should continue to provide services either face to face or remotely. The school SENCo will liaise with services to ensure provision is being offered. We will ask them to become involved if necessary, following the usual graduated response process.
