



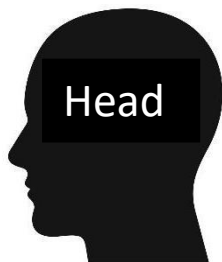
# Kingfisher class - Year 2 and 3

## Spring term 1 - overview of learning



Our topic for this term is 'Extreme Earth'

This term we will be working on the following –



We will learn about the structure of a volcano, how earthquakes happen and other types of extreme weather phenomenon.  
We will identify the key features of a non-chronological report.  
We will read an information story based on the effects of a volcanic eruption and learn about the linguistic features found in setting descriptions.  
We will consolidate our understanding of division.  
We will learn how to recognise, write, add and subtract fractions of amounts and numbers.  
We will learn about the uses of different everyday materials.  
We will further develop our understanding of our school values.



We will continue to reflect on our school value of friendship, and how we can be good friends to each other.  
We will explore what kind of world Jesus wanted.  
We will explore what it means to be part of a family.  
We will reflect on what it might feel like to live in an area where there are natural disasters.



We will write our own setting descriptions.  
We will use role play to explore the character feelings in our story.  
We will write our own non-chronological reports using paragraphs and subheadings to organise our writing.  
We will take part in a trip to a recycling centre to further our learning about materials in the context of recycling.  
We will solve problems involving division and fractions practically, using resources.  
We will make paintings inspired by 'The Great Wave' by Katsushika Hokusai.  
We will continue to learn to play a string instrument.  
We will develop dance and swimming skills.
